

6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

6.2 Does the Institution has a Management Information System

After every three years in accordance with guidelines of UGC and KBCNMU Jalgaon, curriculum development is carried out by Board of Studies of concerned subjects. Accordingly our faculty members contributed towards it.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Institute encourages faculty members to participate Orientation Courses, Refresher Courses, training programmes and Short Term Courses to update their domain knowledge with latest advancement in respective subject.

Teachers and students strictly follow academic calendar and scheduled time table for teaching learning process.

Institute encourages and provides infrastructure for interactive teaching .

Remedial Coaching are conducted for slow learners.

Industrial tours and field visits are organized.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

We are following examination and evaluation pattern provided by affiliating university KBCNMU, Jalgaon.

For first Year of B.Sc. class, semester examinations are conducted by the college and Central Assessment Program is organized in the college campus.

Examinations of M.Sc., Second Year and Third Year of B.Sc. classes are conducted semester wise by the University and online Screen evaluation programmes are also organized by the University.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and Geography departments have Research Laboratories recognized by the university. There is a Centralized Research Instrumentation Laboratory in our college.

Teachers and students from different subjects are involved in research activities.

These research facilities are also made available for outside researchers. Faculty members actively participate Conferences, Seminars and Workshops at State, National and International level.

Faculty members are encouraged to submit research proposals to various funding agencies to fetch research grand.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library is well maintained with adequate infrastructure facility. Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) software is actively used. Departmental libraries are also available.

Each department is having well equipped laboratory with ICT facility. There is a Centralized Research Instrumentation Laboratory.

Adequate classrooms are available . Sports facility and sufficient space for play ground is available.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Staff credits Society is smoothly working. TA/DA and registration fees are provided for attending academic forums. FDP facility is available. Institute takes special efforts for professional development of faculty members

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Well qualified staff is recruited as sanctioned by concern authority. The rules and regulations of the UGC, University and Govt. of Maharashtra are strictly followed.

The staff is inadequate therefore we have appointed required staff on clock hour basis and contract basis.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

Industrial tours –Departments organized study tours to visit manufacturing industries .

Field Visits – Some departments like Botany, Zoology and Geography organized field tours.

Collaborations - The college has signed MoUs with some academic institutions and colleges. The institutions are – Competitive Exam Spectrum Academy, Nasik , research collaboration with S.P.D.M. college, Shirpur, Maharashtra Talent Search Exam Centre for talent search and excellence with N. Wadia College, Pune, To study G.I.S. remote sensing collaboration with V.W.S. college, Dhule.

Separate admission counseling committee is appointed. The curricula and syllabi are made available with the committee. It guides students to select the proper course for their prospective careers. The admission to first year UG and PG is progressively made online.

Best Practices:

Department of Chemistry conduct Chemistry Ability Test (CAT) every year for students from different colleges affiliated to KBCNMU, Jalgaon to test retention of their knowledge

Department of Chemistry conducts Chemistry Ability Test (CAT) Examination since 2006 as a part of celebration of Silver Jubilee year of our institution .

This examination is conducted for First Year and Second Year B.Sc. students from affiliated colleges in university jurisdiction to generate interest in the field of science and to make students aware about higher level competitive examinations like SET, NET, GATE in the field of science. Every year above one thousand students from different colleges participate the activity.

Among these first, second and third rank students are felicitated by giving memento and certificate. In addition to this two more consolation prizes are given .

Facility of instalments in admission fees and Free Accommodation in college hostels for students from economically weaker section.

The adjoining area of college is surrounded by non irrigated agricultural land and tribal region. Student enrolled in the college constitute most of the population coming from this area. Most of the parents are farmers and rely on only rain water for farming, due to this students face financial crisis and not able to pay their admission fees on time.

Hence institute allowed such students to pay their fees in instalments as per their convenience. In addition to this, students from very poor economical background are allowed to avail accommodation free of cost in college hostels
